



English:

As writers this term, we will begin by exploring 'Fantastic Mr Fox'. From exploring this text, we will create character descriptions and write dialogues between two characters. Finally, we will create Newspaper reports about the events we've read about in the text, and applying our SPAG knowledge to our pieces of writing.

Guided reading:

We will be developing our skills to decode and retrieve from texts and develop our understanding to explain and interpret texts. Year 3 will be reading 'an anthology of intriguing animals', and completing comprehension questions about this. Year 2 will be reading the non-fiction book called, 'See inside Ancient Rome'. This relates to our current History topic of Rotten Romans!

MFL

In French this term, we will be learning about playground games, as well as being able to count confidently to 6 by learning through song.

RE:

As children of Bromesberrow, we will be exploring sacred places to people. Our topic is called 'What makes some places sacred to believers?' We will learn about what people do at these places to worship.

Maths:

As mathematicians, year 2 are beginning their multiplication and division unit, whilst year 3 are finishing off their length and perimeter unit and beginning to work on fractions!

Rotten Romans!

PSHE (informed by British values):

As caring members of our community, we will be starting our 'My Happy Mind' topic called 'Relate'. We are exploring how relating to others can form stronger friendships and how valuable it is to understand how others may be feeling in a situation.

History:

As historians this term, we are learning about the 'Rotten Romans'. We will learn about the Roman Empire, as well as learning about how this was ruled. We will explore some key figures of the time, including Julius Caesar, as well as the beliefs of people during the Roman rule.

In summer 2, we will be having a Roman day, where we get an insight into what life would have been like during these times. We will learn about what people ate, what jobs and hobbies they would have had, as well as some jobs people had to earn a living.

Physical Education: As athletes, we will be learning skills within athletics, cricket and rounders this term. We will learn how to play these games competitively and develop our skills in bowling, fielding and batting accurately, whilst working well as a team.

Art: As artists, we will be creating clay houses. Children will be both shaping and decorating clay. They will create a clay tile with house features. They will also be making a range of marks in the clay as well as being able to flatten and smooth it.

Computing: as computer technicians, we will be exploring the application 'Scratch Jr'. This is a coding app and children will be able to use this independently to create loops, whilst making their own code to complete algorithms.

Science:

As scientists, our topic is 'Life on Earth'. We will be learning about a variety of living things, including both plants and animals and the 7 life processes they go through. In this topic we will also be creating shoe box habitats for a chosen animal and learn about why different habitats are suited to different animals and plants.
